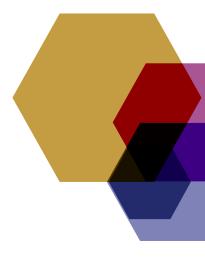

Workshop summaries

FOUNDATION STUDIES

Design Studio: Pop-up Books

Professor Jo Peterson

Session I

Session III

Bring new life to a page by animating it with 3-D and movable components! In this workshop, participants learn the fundamental principles that guide the creation of many interactive pop-up books published today. Beginning with basic tools and techniques, the workshop quickly moves on to building a series of increasingly complex movable structures.

Design Studio: Line in Space

Professor Jo Peterson

Session II

In this workshop, participants create wire sculptures from natural objects. In 2-D applications, lines can be used to define shapes and planes on a flat surface. In this workshop, participants explore how lines drawn with wire can exist through space and how these lines can also suggest shapes and planes.

Drawing Studio: The Figure

Professor Dale Clifford

Session I

Session III

In this workshop, participants explore basic skills and techniques to capture the human form. Using gesture drawings, participants learn to convey the mass, movement and basic proportions of the subject. As the workshop progresses, participants explore the use of value to further render the subject to create a believable illusion of the human form.

Drawing Studio: To Meme or Not To Meme

Professor Dale Clifford

Session II

Session IV

In this workshop, participants create self-portraits, exploring the cultural phenomenon of a "meme" to convey an idea related to the subject. Basic portrait-drawing skills are introduced to capture the human form. Using pen and ink, participants explore both traditional and unorthodox marks to enhance the surface, or physical texture, of the drawing.



Workshop summaries

MAJOR-SPECIFIC*

Character and Creature Design for Games and Animation

Professor Matt Maloney

Session I

Session II

Students design and then create 3-D concept sculptures of creatures or characters used in development for animation, games, film and sequential art. These sculptures—called "maquettes" in the industry—are created from polymer building materials, cured, and primed for painting. Students receive instruction in armature building, sculpting techniques, and general character and creature design practices.

Introduction to Advertising

Professor Ron Wilcox

Session I

This workshop introduces the basic skills required to develop an advertising and marketing campaign. During the development of the campaign, areas covered include campaign assignment, client strategy, brief development and creative concepting.

Introduction to Animation

Professor Kinson Cheung

Session IV

Students are introduced to the history of animation as well as the basic principles of the craft, including the recreation of old time animation, cut-out animation, and 2-D and 3-D animation.

Introduction to Fashion

Professor Yuli Yuferev

Session I

Session II

Session IV

This course addresses the basic elements of fashion design. Students are introduced to the design processes of trend and fabric research, storyboarding compiling, color story, and the development of creative ideas.

Introduction to Game Development

Professor Jose Rueda

Session I

In this workshop, participants learn what it takes to develop games, from generating ideas to designing play and building a game using specialized tools. Developing games involves various disciplines from social sciences to art and technology. Prior experience in computer programming is not required for this workshop. The workshop targets people with a passion for gaming who want to learn how games are made and investigate what aspect of games might be more appealing for them in the production process of a game.

Introduction to Graphic Design

Professor Chris Yin

Session II

This workshop introduces students to the design process and principles of design. Emphasis is placed on problem-solving and graphic design as a form of visual communication. Students learn how to concept, design and implement their creative ideas using industry-standard software.

Introduction to Industrial Design

Professor Owen Foster

Session II

This course introduces students to the industrial design profession. Lectures, discussions and problem-solving exercises explore industrial design as a creative process, examine its history and provide insight into professional opportunities in the field.

Introduction to Motion Media Design

Professor Alvin Chen

Session III

Workshop participants are taught professional tools of the motion media trade, including Cinema 4D, Maya, ZBrush and FCP Studio, to help bring their visions to life.

Introduction to Painting

Professor David Smith

Session III

Session IV

This course is an introduction to the history and techniques of acrylic and watercolor paint. Using thumbnail sketches, technical exercises, color theory and onsite studies, students create two artworks based on a "frame within a frame." Using the window as a theme, the focus is on a tight compositional design, tonal structure and mixing paint using the color wheel.

Introduction to Photography

Professor Evangelo Costadimas

Session IV

Participants learn the latest professional techniques for creating spectacular photographs in multiple genres, including studio lighting, digital retouching and digital printing.


Type Face Design

Session III

This workshop explores the domain of typeface design from a calligraphic, contemporary and deconstructive context, giving participants the opportunity to develop their own design and functioning font. The designs created are based on practical explorations of lettering and calligraphy.

FORMAT

Workshops are taught by SCAD professors; the language of instruction is English.

Workshops may include demonstrations, lectures, studio work and local field trips. During workshop hours, participants have access to the university's facilities, resources and libraries. Supplies are provided, and a HK\$500 supply fee will be charged per workshop. Teen summer workshop participants may choose to attend one or multiple intensive fiveday sessions.

LUNCH

Students will be given a 1.5-hour lunch break each day. Lunch is not included and students may choose to go out or bring their own lunch. Please note that refrigeration will not be available for students. A lunch area will be provided.

CANCELLATION POLICY

For cancellations made two weeks or more prior to the start of the scheduled workshop session, fees will be refunded minus a 25 percent cancellation fee. For cancellations made less than two weeks in advance of the scheduled workshop session, fees will be refunded minus a 50 percent cancellation fee. No refunds will be made after the start of the scheduled session. Please note that if SCAD should have to cancel the workshop for any reason, participants will be refunded in full.

WAITING LIST

A waiting list is established when all spaces in a summer workshop are filled. If the preferred workshop is full, the student may request to be put on a waiting list. If a space becomes available at least two weeks prior to the start of a program, the student is notified. If the student chooses to accept an available spot, the program fee is due immediately.

ARRIVAL/PARKING

Participants arrive and check in at SCAD Hong Kong on Monday morning, the first day of each session. Parking is not available and public transportation is recommended. The Sham Shui Po MTR Station (exit D2) is the MTR station closest to SCAD Hong Kong.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Classes may be cancelled or rescheduled if a Typhoon Signal No. 8 or Black Rainstorm Warning is issued. Students and parents/guardians will be notified of schedule changes via the email address(es) provided.

DEPARTURE
